

**THE HARTLAND/LAKESIDE SCHOOL DISTRICT
NOTICE OF EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS FOR CHILDREN WHO RESIDE IN THE
SCHOOL DISTRICT
as required by WI State Statutes 115.385 & 118.57**

The Hartland/Lakeside School District offers students a variety of educational options to children who reside in the District. The District's primary educational pathway and instructional program for students involves a progression from 4K through 8th grade.

Hartland/Lakeside School District's most recent (**2013-2014** school year) performance category, as assigned by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) under section 115.385 of the state statutes, is as follows:

- **Hartland/Lakeside District – 79.4 – Exceeds Expectations**
- Hartland Fine Arts Leadership Academy – Alternate Rating – Satisfactory Progress (this score is a reflection that data was not available due to timing of the school opening)
- Hartland North – 75.3 – Exceeds Expectations
- Hartland School of Community Learning – 78.4 – Exceeds Expectations
- Hartland South Elementary – 82.1 – Exceeds Expectations
- LIFE – 80.7 – Exceeds Expectations
- North Shore Middle School – 80.4 – Exceeds Expectations

Educational options for students who are enrolled in Hartland/Lakeside School District that involve part-time attendance at an additional educational institution include the following:

- Students may attend Arrowhead High School for Advanced Math courses not offered onsite.

Additional educational options for children who reside in the District that involve full-time enrollment/attendance at a school, program, or other educational institution that is not a school or instrumentality of Hartland/Lakeside School District include the following:

- Attendance at public schools
- Attendance at private schools participating in the Wisconsin Private School Choice Program
 - For the 2015-2016 school year, there are currently no private schools located within the Hartland/Lakeside School District that are participating in the Private School Choice Program.
- Attendance at charter schools
 - For the 2015-2016 school year, there are currently no independent charter schools located within the Hartland/Lakeside School District.
- Attendance at virtual schools
 - For the 2015-2016 school year, there are currently no virtual schools located within the Hartland/Lakeside School District
- Full-time open enrollment; and
- Options for pupils enrolled in a home-based private educational program including, interscholastic athletics and extracurricular activities

Educational options for children who reside in the Hartland/Lakeside School District boundaries, but who are enrolled in and attending a private school or home-based private educational program include the following:

Such students have the opportunity to attend summer school classes/programs offered in the District, provided eligibility requirements are met.

Students who are enrolled in a home-based private educational program have the opportunity to:

- Apply for approval to take up to two courses per semester in public schools, provided space is available and pursuant to section 118.53 of the state statutes.

- Participate in District interscholastic athletics and other District extra-curricular activities as provided under the section 118.133 of the state statutes.
